

# Counselors are here to help



-What did you do at school today?

Nothing . -

Do you have any homework?

Nope.



Parents at Madison Middle and around the world have asked these same questions daily and have probably gotten the same responses. Please know that we feel your pain; our own children say the same thing when asked at home.

Here are some tips that can help parents navigate the growing pains of middle school independence while staying involved in your child's education. These tips will help your child develop study habits and can aid in reducing anxiety. I've noticed when my students complete homework or study for a test, they feel more confident and comfortable in school.



# What to do when your child says they have no homework:

#### 1. ORGANIZE YOUR BACKPACK

SAY: "GREAT, since you have no homework, this is a good night to organize your backpack."

Parents, set a timer for 10 minutes for your student to organize their backpack. It's important that they take the lead on this task. They might rediscover assignments they need to finish or recall that they should study for an upcoming test or quiz. Even if they don't find anything pressing, having everything in order will give them peace of mind.

#### **Guide for Organizing**

If there are lots of loose papers, the student needs to sort papers into stacks based on the subject: ELA, Math, Science, History, Computer. Then they can hole-punch and put them into their binders.

**GOAL:** NO loose papers or trash in the backpack.

#### 2. STUDY VOCABULARY

SAY, "GREAT, since you have no homework, this is a good night to go over your vocabulary."

**Science** – Vocab will be located in their test packet or notes; when in doubt check Canvas.

**ELA** – Wordly Wise – Students cannot bring their workbooks home BUT check Canvas, and the activity pages are usually posted.

History - Vocab will be posted on Canvas.

#### 3. CHECK ACTIVE STUDENT

SAY, "GREAT, since you have no homework, this is a good night for you to check grades and email your teachers about missing assignments."

#### **Guide for Students:**

- 1. Check Active Student for any missing assignments.
- 2.Complete the missing assignment if it is on Canvas, then email your teacher that you completed the assignment.
- 3. If they cannot complete the assignment at home, have your student email their teacher to set up a time to complete the missing assignment. (Teachers love it when students take initiative.)

#### 4. COMMUNICATE WITH YOUR TEACHERS

Still unsure about what students need to do for homework, try these steps:

When in doubt, check Canvas. I recommend your student check Canvas, and you can supervise and follow along to learn more about Canvas. Your student knows Canvas well.

Email the teacher – Students have a @madison-schools.com email address where they can easily email their teachers. I recommend screening the email before they hit send, just to help fluff. Teachers love getting emails from students! They may not respond until school hours, but the email will serve as a reminder for the student and teacher about the assignment or question. This skill will also help your child flex that responsibility muscle, build good communication skills, and encourage a positive relationship with their teacher.



Our expectation for homework is not hours of assignments. However, starting in 6th grade, about 30 minutes is a reasonable amount of time, and it should increase a bit for those in 7th or 8th grade or enrolled in advanced courses. I recommend setting a timer; it helps them have a defined, short-term goal and reminds me to check on their progress too!


#### Welcome to Our Drama Program!
